GP engagement

Sonder's Northern and Southern Region GP Councils provide an opportunity:

- For GPs to raise issues that affect general practice and its ability to provide effective primary health care in the community;
- For input, advocacy and linkage into the acute sector;
- To ensure there is adequate GP representation on various panels and committees and act as the conduit for GPs across the region.

The Northern Region GP Council has 8 members, elected by their peers who represent a broad range of expertise and interests across general practice. The Council consists of three members representing the north, three representing the north east and 2 representing the metropolitan region, north of the Torrens River.

The Southern Region GP Council was founded in 2016, with eight GPs currently practising in the southern Adelaide metropolitan region making up the Council.
