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ABOUT US

The Northern Health Network (NHN), formerly the Adelaide Northern Division of General Practice (ANDGP), was commissioned in 1993 and is now in its 21st year.

We provide support to General Practices in the Northern Adelaide region and have a long reputable history of advocacy and service delivery.

In April 2013, NHN transferred all of its service delivery and staff to the Northern Adelaide Medicare Local (NAML). All the services previously delivered by us have continued seamlessly under the operation of the NAML.

The NHN currently stands in our primary health landscape as a membership-based organisation, and strives to support General Practices in the region. Our members comprise a large number of individuals from the local health professional community. They include General Practitioners, Practice Managers, Nurses and Allied Health professionals.

NHN is a foundation member of the NAML, along with 9 other Membership Consortium Groups (MCGs). The Northern Region GP Council (NRGPC), Practice Managers, Nurses and Allied Health professionals forms the General Practice MCG, with the other 8 MCGs focused on: Palliative Care, older persons and aged care, Medical Specialists, Mental Health, Aboriginal Health, Carers and Consumers, Disability and Childhood.

The NRGPC provides valuable strategic and practical input on all primary health matters that effect General Practice. This ensures that issues and gaps are identified and solutions are able to be worked on and implemented.

We will continue to support all facets of General Practice and primary health and will continue to act as the conduit into Medicare Locals and other State and Commonwealth forums to ensure our community can access quality primary health care.

One of the primary objectives has been to conduct training sessions to prepare our upcoming doctors for their Fellowship of General Practice and AMC Exams. It is encouraging to see their success rate has been very high, with significant numbers of these candidates now practicing within our region.

As a result of reduced sources of income, NHN has had to refocus its priorities. To that end, we're extremely grateful these training sessions have been generously supported by NAML and various other organisations such as Avant and Astrazeneca.

Another key priority for us this year is our IMGs and addressing the challenges they face in sourcing Practices to do their Observership. We are currently designing a programme that will incentivise General Practices to take on IMGs for a specific period.

The Northern Region GP Council (NRGPC), a subcommittee of NHN since 2012 has been very active, contributing a great deal to primary health care positions and liaising with other services, including our hospital systems.


